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



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

# DISTANT LOVE SHOVANA & HERBERT

# Could you briefly describe your relationship?

Shovana: Herbert and I have been married for thirty-five and a half years (we met in Dec 1979 and we got married in May 1982) and still it feels like a new romance. Despite our different colours of skin (he is European, and I am an Indian), different countries, cultural milieu and faith that we are born in, essentially what we both believe and practice is the same: namely faith, trust, belief in each other, respect for each other as a person and for each other's identity and space, respect for mankind irrespective of all differences, respect for difference of opinion, respect for each other's family, compassion and sensitivity, all of which forms the basis of love. How often do we see that couples from similar backgrounds, cultures and states, living 24x7 together drift apart! Hence distance and proximity are not key factors to a happy relationship! Ours was a long-distance courtship and long-distance marriage as we were both entrenched in our respective careers (he, representing his country as the Ambassador in different parts of the world and I serving as an IAAS officer in India and fulfilling all my obligations as a well-known Indian classical dancer). But distance never came between us as we both practiced and had supreme love, trust and faith in each other.

# How did you meet?

**Shovana:** I met him at a performance of mine on 4th Dec 1979. He was intrigued that a well-known young dancer was also a Master's in Physics and serving on the Indian Audit and Accounts Service. This interest encouraged him to meet me courtesy of a few common friends and well after that it was history. At that point of time he was at the end of his posting in India (He served here in India as Deputy Head of the Austrian Mission from 1975 to May 1980). Hence it was a long distance courtship in an age when there were no mobiles, etc.

# Given your high-profile career engagements – how were you able to maintain your relationship?

**Shovana:** We were clear that since neither would be giving up their respective careers, we would be having as we laughingly say, "quarterly marriage"! Neither of us being in our respective positions could have the luxury of taking long leaves. Therefore we used to meet every two and a half or three months for 10-12 days at a time. Besides the solid foundation of love there was also a solid foundation of trust, belief and faith in each other and a very healthy respect for each other's achievements and persona that has seen us and is still seeing us through our married life. We are always there for each other at all times!

# Was it easy for you to carry on with a long-distance relationship/marriage?

**Herbert:** From my side it was relatively simple and clear, I had realized that I was in love with her and that she was a very special person with multiple talents and professional engagements. The point was to find a way how to be together as much as possible and yet keep our own identities which had to be accepted by each of us. We fell in love with each other as we were so why would we want to change the other? So the point was and is to accept the other as she or he is.

# Did the distance take a toll on your relationship at all?

**Shovana:** Not at all! If you love a person or love what you are doing with sincerity and dedication everything falls into place.

# Would you change anything about your relationship

Nothing. We both have allowed each other to grow as human beings and as professionals taking pride in each other's achievements as well as watching our son grow and settling down. We were totally involved with each other's families and were there for each other. We love each other, we respect each other, we have full trust, faith and belief in each other and we share the same values, morals and ethics, etc.

# **SECOND** CHANCES HUDA & BUB



# Could you briefly describe your relationship?

Huda: We've been together for 10 years and married for five. We both believe that we were meant to go down the path we did because our family was supposed to be complete the way it is now. Both of us had kids and were unhappy in our relationships. Our relationship is very open, very loving and very caring. We both put our kids first and we both invest a lot of time into making US work.

## How did you meet?

Huda: We had initially met when I was 18 and my husband was 21 and we worked together at Wal-Mart. I was the cashier and he was the stocker boy. I remember thinking he was cute and one evening during my shift I walked over to his department and decided to help him stock shelves. That was the only shift we worked together during our time at Wal-Mart and that shift changed my entire life, but I did not know it at that time. I remember thinking to myself after our shift that I would never be with a guy like that. However, for my husband he says for some reason I left an imprint on his heart. At that time I was extremely naive, cultured and close to my roots - all the things he was missing in his life at that time. He says that's what made him curious and made him remember me. We both went our separate ways and never thought twice

about anything, well I didn't, but he did. He went home and told his mom that if there was any girl he was going to marry it would be me. I know sounds so Bollywood, but for 6 years he stuck to that statement. During the six years both of our lives were upside down, I had gotten married and had two kids and he had a son with his partner at the time. I was unhappy in my relationship and he was just trying to stay a float. Facebook had only been around for two years at that time and his friend recommended it and said you could find ANYONE on there. So he made an account and first thing he did

was try to look for me. He found 3 Huda's at the time and messaged all three of them, one of them was me.

# I understand you were both in relationships before meeting so was it hard to date, fall in love and marry?

Bub: With us it has always been very simple. We met after six years that night and it felt like I had known her all my life. I never had to try, I was myself and it just felt natural. It sounds corny, but I had never been in a relationship with a Pakistani Muslim girl before and none of my relationships lasted over 3 months. So, when Huda and I got together I was feeling things I had never felt before. I was the first one to say I love you literally two weeks into knowing each other again. We took our time to get to know each other, we travelled a lot. When we met I had just started school again to become a fire fighter so marriage was not on my mind for a while. It had nothing to do with her but I wanted to be stable before we made the leap to get married. It was never hard with her, everything always just felt natural. We had to go through many learning curves and I had to learn how to be in a long-term relationship which I never had before so that definitely took some time.

# What were some of the hardships you faced being in a serious relationship after a divorce?

Huda: We had to deal with each other's pasts, we had to deal with constant larger than life problems. My ex-husband was

very difficult and still is which caused a lot of strain during our marriage. Our kids were also babies so we only saw each other once a week if that. Bub was in school studying and also working full time with lots of overtime so balancing and making time for each other was hard. It was hard on my parents as well to watch me juggle divorce and watch me date again. It's not easy for a parent to let their daughters openly date in our culture so I appreciated their support and patience. We had to break the stereo type in his family as well. Bringing a woman in the family with two children was not the easiest of things for my husband. He had to battle comments and stand up for us many times.

# What are some of the benefits of this kind of relationship?

We both feel we got a second chance at life and because of that we are always grateful for the relationship and family we have built today. We don't take each other for granted and we always talk about how God blessed us with a family that many can only dream of. Our kids are amazing and together we fit perfectly into each other's lives. We also get time to our selves when the children are at their other parent's houses. It allows us to connect and appreciate the struggles we have been through as a couple and individuals.


# What do you have to say about the stiama surroundina divorce especially in the South Asian communities HUDA'S AT THE TIME and have you faced any?

Yes! Of course there is stigma and of course people talk. When I got divorced I was 21 with two kids. People talked about my parents and spread rumors that they were incapable of parenting, that I was never going to find anyone. They pitied me when they saw me along with two kids at family gatherings. My parents had to suffer a lot from our community. They automatically assume that its your fault and that you must have done something wrong. No one wants

to ask you questions to your face, but they seem to have all the answers behind your back. I was very young when all this was happening so a lot of it seems like a blur. My husband also had to face questions and listen to others talk about the fact that he was going to marry someone who came with baggage. Two kids meant baggage, not a blessing and till this day our community still perceives women who are divorced with stigma and pity. If only our communities helped build women who are strong and protected the women who are struggling in bad or abusive marriages we would be so much more stronger and capable to provide and build homes for our children.

# What would you say to someone who is staying in a relationship out of fear to be divorced?

They say life can flash by in a blink of an eye. I say if you are in a bad marriage it can feel like an eternity. For me, I didn't know how beautiful life was till I got out of my first marriage. It felt like being reborn. I was happy, just happy. There are many ways to get out of the situation you are in, however the only thing you need to have by your side is strength and courage, If you can find the strength even for a second, leave, then do it. You will thank yourself for the rest of your life. People complicate things and spend way too much time planning out every detail, you just have to do it like anything else in life. Things fall apart, but things also mend with time. You can rebuild everything in your life but staying in a marriage out of fear is like being in prison all your life - don't do it.





# Could you please tell us a bit about yourselves?

Mani was born in Dubai and Darsh in India. We both moved to Canada at an early age and currently reside in one of the most multicultural cities in the world: Toronto, Canada. We met at McMaster University and fell in love shortly after. We have now been together for over 11 years and have been married for 2 years.

# Could you briefly describe your relationship?

We both are complete opposites in a lot of ways. Darsh has a very laid-back kind of personality, whereas Mani always needs to be doing something to keep herself occupied. Darsh likes to live in the present and not be concerned on what's coming next, however Mani always has a plan or is busy making a plan. We believe, we are living proof that opposites do attract. What keeps the spark alive is our wanderlust for an adventure. Travel and new experiences are at the heart of our relationship, which fueled the creation of our brand, MDOUTOFOFFICE

# How did you meet and how long after meeting did you start dating?

We met each other through mutual friends during our first year attending McMaster University. For Mani, it was crush-at-first-sight, however nothing progressed as Darsh was involved in a long-distance relationship with a girlfriend from high school. By the start of our second year, Darsh was single and shortly after we both started to hang out more often and found any reason to be around each other. We attended each other's lectures during our spare time and hung out a lot at Thode, an on-campus library. How romantically nerdy, right? We slowly realized we both wanted to be more than just friends. Realizing this, Darsh did not want to take a chance so he made a calculated decision and asked Mani to be his girlfriend on his 19th birthday. After all, who'd have the heart to say NO to the birthday-boy? She said YES and 11 years later here we are.

# Would you say you are college sweethearts? Yes, absolutely!

# Were you in a constant relationship since University or were there breaks prior to deciding to get married?

As with most relationships, we have had our fair-share of ups and downs. As young adults who started dating in their teens, we had a lot of growing up to do and were struggling to figure out who we were as individuals. Post our initial honeymoon stage we struggled to maintain a healthy balance between social & personal relationships. We faced numerous hardships and challenges during our dating years. Thankfully we persevered and our path truly makes us appreciate our current happily ever after.

What are some of the differences, if any between traveling when not married and now? This one is easy. There are none. Well not in how we travel but whom we tell when we are travelling. I know this does not encourage good behavior in our community but I'm sure everyone who has strict, traditional South Asian families is guilty of traveling with their significant other

without parental consent. At first, we missed the taboo feeling of sneaking around after being married, but seeing our family share our excitement when we discuss our travel plans definitely enhances our experience.

# When and why did you start sharing your traveling experiences/relationship online?

Darsh has always been a social butterfly and loves to share his life & travel experiences with friends and family. He also loves photography and traveling gave him a purpose to invest in his passion. He always mentioned that he does not want the standard selfies and landscape pictures because he wants meaningful pictures he can use to decorate our home. Instagram allowed him to share his journey and create a time-line of our travels to share with the world. At first Mani was hesitant but has since grown fond of this project together as she also loves to use our account to reminisce and fuel future travels.

# What were some of the hardships you face in this type of relationship of being with someone since University/being travel buddies?

Contrary to popular belief, travelling is a lot of work. In our early years, we struggled to divide and allocate appropriate responsibilities such as research, accommodation bookings, & organizing daily itineraries for our upcoming travels. To add, neither one of us come from wealthy families so planning travels on a budget can be a challenging task.We both had and still have a common goal of making the most of our travel dollar.

# What are some of the benefits of this kind of relationship?



# CANADA'S FIRST COUPLE MR. AND MRS. TRUDEAU

ong before they became leaders, this couple has always been a Canadian favourite.

Prime Minister Justin Trudeau and his wife Sophie Gregoire Trudeau have always played an active role in many aspects of Canadian society. Prior to becoming "the first couple", the pair was involved in not only the political scene, but in many others including the Canadian entertainment and social life, numerous charities and non-profit organizations, religious inclusivity, women's rights and much more. This behaviour along with the couple's personal relationship continues to set an example for all Canadians to be better and move towards becoming a loving and

In fact, the two reconnected when they co-hosted a fundraising event in 2003. Despite having known each other since childhood (Sophie and Justin's youngest brother were friends and classmates), the pair did not connect romantically until they went out

However, once they did go out - the one date was all they needed according to what Justin told MacLean's in an interview about how they met. "I looked at her and I just felt this strength and peace come over me and I said, 'Well, it's about time you arrived. It's been 32 years and I was beginning to think you would never show up. I've been waiting for you all my life. You're it!' I knew it right then and I announced to her that we would be spending the rest of our lives together." He wasn't kidding, a year later he proposed and another year later they were married. Presently, the couple is happily married with three kids, Ella-Grace, Xavier and Hadrien.

Since then, Justin and Sophie Trudeau have attended and participated in a lot of events in Canada. Their openness to all kinds of events and their relatability is a major factor in what makes Canadians love the couple so much. The pair is often seen attending social events throughout the country including the Toronto International Film Festivals, Pride Parades, AwardShows, Galas and Balls. If there is any major social events across Canada the Trudeau couple is not far behind.

While the couple seems to like having fun and enjoying social events, there are also a lot of events that they attend which have a more serious theme. Both Justin and Sophie are quite involved in supporting different kinds of charities and non-profit organizations. Mrs. Trudeau is an advocate for issues including self-esteem, eating disorders, mental health and many issues relating to women and children. She was actually the recipient of the 2013 UN Women National Committee Canada Recognition Award for her contribution to human rights. Mr. Trudeau is just as involved, issues that he advocates for include education, the environment and the younger generations economic prospects. I've always tried to make sure that my daughter feels empowered, that she understands that her gender does not - and should never - determine the limits of what she can accomplish. But Sophie reminded

me that I need to spend just as much time and effort engaging my sons, talking to them about feminism and the importance of equality." Some of the specific causes Sophie has supported include the Dove "Pay Beauty Forward" Program, 60 Million Girls Foundation, The Weekend to End Breast Cancer and Plan Canada's "Because I am a Girl". Justin is not far behind in his support for women's rights, he can constantly be seen advocating for gender equality - much of his support can be seen through the changes made to the structure of the government. Once elected in 2015, Trudeau formed Canada's first gender-balanced cabinet. He continues to reflect his support of gender equality through his leadership and the direction he is taking Canada towards. He has taken a similar stance and route towards ridding of religious and cultural discrimination in Canada.

The Trudeau couple has always been very inclusive and accepting of all faiths and races. Prior to being Prime Minister, Justin Trudeau would attend religious seminars to show his support for different religions. He would and still does celebrate and participate in events and holidays from all kinds of religions and cultures. This religious and cultural inclusivity is something he has implemented as Prime Minister. As he outlined in an address in the UK in 2015, "We have a responsibility—to ourselves and to the world—to show that inclusive diversity is a strength, and a force that can vanquish intolerance, radicalism and hate. by example to be as open as he and his family are and guite honestly always have been.

It is refreshing to see a power couple that is relatable and honest. The actions they are taking now or the issues they are standing up for are not just something they took on upon being elected, but things they have done since long before that. That goes to show that they are genuine in their efforts. That genuine aspect along with the couples very relatable relationship and personalities is what has made many Canadians become as accepting and caring as the Trudeau couple. They are truly Canada's first couple leading the remainder of us to a better future for everyone. It seems in this case that the apple does not fall far from the tree. Justin's father and 15th Prime Minister of Canada, Pierre Elliott Trudeau was loved and served Canada similarly to his son.

It seems as if Justin is continuing the work his father laid the groundwork for. When in office, Pierre Elliott expanded the size and role of the Prime Minister's office, an office which Justin also had a huge impact on changing. 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

Every New Year is accompanied with a new fashion trend or trends. According to Cynthia Florek, it takes about 10 years for a fashion trend to evolve, which means the trends we love right now have probably been around since 2008! SHE got a chance to speak with style expert and trend forecaster Cynthia Florek at the 2017 Apparel Textile Sourcing Canada (ATSC) trade show to bring you the rundown on all things fashion! The ATSC is Canada's premier international apparel and textile sourcing event. It features local and international exhibits, three days of seminars, panels and sessions and a fashion runway showcasing Canadian student and international exhibitor designs. Moreover, it gives many an opportunity to meet international apparel, textile, fashion and fabric manufacturers and leaders. The event first took place in Canada in 2016 and has become larger since. This year's tradeshow will be held from August 20-22, 2018!

# In your presentation you were talking about trends, forecast, colours, fabrics, cuts and everything, how are you so knowledgeable in forecasting trends?

Research, research, research. I am constantly reading, looking at news, looking at upcoming trends and I look at the seeds. Seeds are the little pallets of information and then I connect the dots. A seed basically turns and grows. A trend starts at 0 and then it takes about 10 years to evolve. This is done through a series of retail analysis, new brands emerging, runway, and also fabric mills and new vendors. It takes a compilation of all those things to kind of track where trends start and how they are going to evolve.

### What is your trend forecast for this year?

We are going to see shine, we are going to see velvet - velvet is a very strong fabric, basically anything with rich textures. It's about an evolution not a revolution, but it's sill going to be a very laid back style too.

## What advice would you give to someone who wants to break into the fashion market in Canada?

Well first of all we have to look at what their product is to make sure it speaks to the right demographic. Then we can assess to make sure their product is on trend and is packaged properly for buyers because eventually that's what you want to do. So the how-to guide really depends on each business and how they want to get into the market. It depends on if you are doing ecommerce verses brick and mortar or if you are making appointments. So I would facilitate the process for each individual client.

### Do you think it's a right time to become a fashion designer in Canada? What is your opinion of the Canadian fashion industry?

I have mixed feelings about it. We are living in a changing retail landscape. I feel like for young designers there are a lot more opportunity just because of ecommerce. They have a voice, which can transcend where you are. So you can be located in Waterloo and still sell around the world. With that said, there are so many people who are doing it that it's hard to kind of find your voice and to market yourself properly. This is when certain marketing techniques come into play.

# Which Canadian designers would you say are on top of their game?

There's quite a few. The first two that kind of come to mind are Sid Neigum and Bowfield. These are examples of designers that have been in the market for less than 5 years and Nita Purtay just picked them up so now they are on an international platform. Greta Constantine has also done wonders for the Canadian market. They just celebrated their 10-year anniversary. All these brands have gone on Paris and London fashion weeks, which is great in bringing Canadians on the map internationally.

## Do you think there is a gradual shift from fast fashion to smaller brands, more indie brands?

Definitely. There is a slow fashion movement and it's kind of like a backlash to the fast fashion unfortunately. Fast Fashion does come at an affordable price so sometimes indie brands





can offer the same and not be competitive. I feel like brands are being more transparent now and it's all about the story telling of the brand. So being authentic and offering a point of view.

## Do you think e-commerce and social media has changed how millennials shop?

Definitely. Before you would go to the mall and have a choice of 10 stores, your favourite 10 stores. Now your world is your oyster so the choice that millennials will have is endless, they can order something online and return it if they don't like it. They have much more choice, but again it's being able to infiltrate the millennial to want your brand, that's a bit harder.

## What is your opinion of Toronto Fashion Week?

I think it's been in transition for quite a bit, but I feel that it's going over a transformation and it's evolving. I think the fact that it's joined with men's fashion week is quite interesting. Designers need a platform and I think this is a great platform for designers to come and to basically showcase during TOM and TWFW.









# SNEHA VARMA

# TELL US A LITTLE BIT ABOUT YOURSELF AND YOUR BRAND.

My name is Sneha Varma and I am a Canadian handbag designer. I am of a mixed heritage (my father is Indian from Mauritius and my late mother was French Canadian). I grew up in the suburbs of Brampton, Ontario with my parents and two sisters. I now live with my husband and two sons in the Ancaster, Ontario suburbs. Ever since I was young, I was a naturally creative individual. Fashion and architecture were my main interests and I greatly enjoyed sketching and designing for fun. Our mother would make and sew all her own clothing. I was fascinated by her abilities and she taught us about the importance of well tailored clothing and textiles. However, for some reason, I never thought that it would be an acceptable choice to follow a creative career path (this was going back 20+ years ago). So, I picked a traditional career to study and became an accountant. About six years ago, I could no longer ignore my inner desire to have a creative outlet. Therefore, I turned to fashion and decided to create my own line of women's handbags. At the time, I could not find what I was looking for, aesthetically, in an attainable price point, in a handbag and therefore saw an opportunity to help fill that gap. In addition, entrepreneurship is a seed that has been implanted in me since I was young by my parents (my father is an entrepreneur), so it was a naturally fitting choice to pursue this avenue. My brand is named after me and is heavily inspired by the style makers of the world. I am instantly drawn to someone who has a good sense of style; a style that is effortless and timeless but not in an overly classic sort of way. The brand makes every effort to mimic this idea.

# WHAT IS THE INSPIRATION BEHIND YOUR UPCOMING COLLECTION AND WHAT IS THE POWER OF THE HANDBAG?

The power of the handbag is that it is multipurpose – first, it solves the problem of where to house your essentials by storing it all in something beautiful. It gives instant style. Add a new bag to old jeans and a tee and you have an instant wardrobe update. But more importantly, a handbag is universal – it is suited for everyone and has no bearing on body size or shape. So there really is something for everyone which is liberating. My inspiration for all collections always goes back to this muse that I visualize in my head that has that effortless sense of style. In my opinion, nothing trumps that and, so I am constantly inspired to mimic every collection as closely as I can to my muse.

# IS THERE A REASON YOU ONLY FOCUS ON PURSES AND ARE YOU PLANNING ON EXPANDING YOUR COLLECTION?

I have only focused on handbags because that is where I have been the most drawn to. However, I









am becoming more and more obsessed with small leather goods (i.e. Pouches, credit card holders, etc.) so I am thinking of exploring this avenue in the future.

# WHAT ARE SOME OF THE STRUGGLES YOU FACED IN STARTING YOUR OWN BUSINESS AND HOW DID YOU OVER-COME THEM?

My background is in accounting and business. The elephant in the room is that I have no formal training in fashion/design nor did I have any experience working in the fashion industry. But, there was no way that I was going to let that stop me. I had way too much drive, not to try. Therefore, once I set out to start my business, I was stepping foot in a completely new and unknown territory. I had to learn everything from the ground up. No one was going to do this for me, so I had to work hard and be completely dedicated to this new journey. Mistakes were made along the way, but I just had to take ownership of it, learn from it and move on. I have learned so much since I started; it has been an invaluable learning experience.

# WHAT IS SOME ADVICE YOU WOULD GIVE TO SOMEONE TRYING TO START THEIR OWN BUSINESS?

I would advise to never let fear take over and prevent you from starting, first and foremost. Whatever you don't know, find a way to learn it. With that, make a plan. I often hear that you must act right away. Although I do agree, I do feel it's vital to take some time (but not too much time) to create a roadmap of where you want to go and how you plan on getting there.

# WHAT IS THE BEST PIECE OF ADVICE YOU EVER RECEIVED AS AN ENTREPRE-NEUR?

The best piece of advice that I've ever received would be from my father, who said that you must continuously re-orient yourself and your business in order to grow.

# WHAT DO YOU SEE FOR THE FUTURE OF YOUR BRAND?

I envision a future of creating handbags that people love and enjoy, eventually spinning off into different product categories that will provide a benefit to people's lives. Nothing would make me happier than to eventually see a standalone brick and mortar location for the brand, even though we are living in an ecommerce era. There's just something about a beautiful piece of real estate through which to present your brand that gets me so excited!

For Azeemeh Zaheer, Executive Managing Director & CEO at Naissance Capital Real Estate Ltd this is still not enough, she is on a mission to give back and share her knowledge with as many women and people as she can. SHE got a chance to learn all about Azeemeh's journey and her view on women in finance.

## To begin can I ask how and why you chose to get into Finance?

I did not intend to get into finance; it was a mix of luck and timing. I wanted to be a CNN News Anchor Woman, but that's life. I worked at a Bank of America branch when I was 16-years-old as part of a cooperative program in high school and my till was situated next to the personal bankers' desks. I spent my spare time talking to them about various retail banking products and unintentionally "crosssold" to every customer that walked into my line. So much so, I doubled the branch's revenue and was promoted into a leadership program within 6 months. I spent a number of years in various banking roles and departments as I worked towards my investment licenses and attended university. After some time, I wanted a change and left banking. I spent 3.5 years working the public sector as Vice Consul, Head of US Oil and Gas for British Consulate General. Trying to find a solution for the oil and gas companies in distress, I invited the Lord Mayor of London and a handful of Shariah Compliant Banks to evaluate local debt opportunities with companies that owned hard assets. During the visit, the Chairman of one of the Shariah Compliant banks offered me a job in London. I accepted the offer, which relocated me to the United Kingdom and led me to Shariah Complaint Investment Banking. The bank was small enough to provide me real exposure to all aspects of the business, deal making as well as the underlying investors. I was in the right place at the right time. had an amazingly challenging experience that eventually equipped me with the right tools, contacts and knowledge to open up my own firm, Naissance Capital Real Estate Ltd (NCRE). I started NCRE two years ago and we have over \$100M assets under management. The real passion for our firm is hands on asset management and the deployment of technology strategies to provide solutions. To us, investment is the ability to see value and grow that value over time. We invest into local communities because without their wellbeing, our assets wouldn't be relevant. People matter. Communities matter. Local knowledge matters.

### What is your view on women and finance?

# I know you spoke at the World Economic Islamic Forum in 2013 about women in Islamic finance, could you clarify what Islamic finance is?

ans terms of repayment should be fixed. Seco Il parties in a financial transaction must share both the risks and the rewards. Thirdly, you cannot sell what you do not own, which is intended to eliminate speculation. Lastly, each financial transaction must relate to a tangible or identifiable underlying asset. In its true form, Shariah compliant banking ties us into the real economy. There are many variations to how this is implemented depending on the Shariah scholar.

Each country in the Middle East is different. Looking at the GCC specifically, Kuwait was the pioneer. They had a number of women making key financial decisions in leading roles for over 15 years. Maha Al-Ghunaim was one these key pioneers. The Kingdom of Saudi Arabia has been catching up and making some big changes. Over the past few years we are itnessing more Saudi women being appointed to Chief Executive positions. Lubna Suliman Olayan led the charge in Saudi Arabia. The UAE and Qatar governments are doing a great job acknowledging and supporting women in finance.

# From what I understand you are taking some steps to better educate women about their finances in the Middle East, can you touch on that?

or the past 6 years, I have been teaching the principles of e investment banking from an industry perspective li Arabia, Kuwait and Qatar.We work very closely with hen's University in Saudi Arabia and teach a week me in their MBA course. We teach students practiestment principles our courses also allow students experience, providing participants with the tools to develop an investment thesis, review invest ment memorandum and understand fee structures.

These women will be the future leaders and have a lot of qualifications. We teach them practical tools that enable them to transition into employment.

in workplaces, and the level of violence they encounter remains higher than men. A 2014 statistic comparing fulltime/full-year average wages reveals the gender gap at 26 per cent. This indicates that for every \$1 earned by a man, a woman working only gains \$0.74. The gap is more dramatic for Aboriginals and women of colour. On the other hand, countries like India still face discrimination due to the dominance of patriarchal culture. Countries like Afghanistan are guilty of violence against women, as a case was reported and documented by the British government in 2016 exposing over 130 cases of sexual violence, which included 241 murders. In addition, the Women Rehabilitation Center in Nepal pointed out that between 5,000-12,000 females aged 10 to 20 are trafficked yearly. Despite evidence of progress, gray areas exist, as inequality is still a current trial we hope to triumph. In several countries, although legally women are designed to have equal rights as men, such laws become unadaptable, and are therefore customized in a social context.

Women began their fight generations before us and will continue after us. They are a force of nature. Impossibilities back then have been made possible for us today. It is unfortunate that inequality is a key factor in our struggles, but universally we can divide and conquer. After all, things worth having take time.

# The Cultured Barbie

Barbie's black friend Christie has been by Barbie's side since 1968, but it wasn't until 1980 that the first official African-American Barbie came out alongside a Latina Barbie. Following this breakthrough, many international dolls were released including India Barbie! In 1993 the Native American Barbie was released as part of the "Dolls of the World-North America" collection. With its rich culture and proud heritage, this Barbie pays homage to the roots of Indiaenous people across Canada and the United States.

# The Inclusive Barbie

To reach out to Barbie's male following, David and Phillipe Blond created Blond Diamond Barbie in 2012. Even though the Barbie is not called "drag queen Barbie," cross-dressing New-York designer Phillipe Blond inspired i Barbie broke gender stereotypes in this moment, but it also created backlash at the same time.

Mattel Inc. came up with the idea to create a "Fashionistas" collection in 2015, which included seven skin tones, over twenty eye colors, and three new body types including petite, tall, and curvy. Not only was the doll becoming more ethnically diverse, but she also came in all shapes and sizes! The pressure of young girls to feel like they needed to be as skinny as Barbie was gone and completely changed the definition of beauty for the brand.

Most recently, the first Hijab Barbie was announced in November 2017, which was inspired by fencing Olympian Ibtihaj Muhammad. Muhammad was chosen as a one-of-a-kind "Shero" where the brand honours females who inspire young girls to surpass boundaries. The Barbie is an identical representation of Muhammad! Now young girls who felt that the religion was excluded from the Barbie world can look at this Barbie and feel self-acceptance.


uman trafficking, as defined by the Criminal Code of Canada, occurs when someone recruits, transports, transfers, receives, holds, conceals or harbours a person, or exercises control, direction or influence over the movements of a person for the purpose of exploitation. The victims suffer from emotional trauma, as well as economic, physical and sexual abuse. It is an international issue that occurs mostly in one's home country with sexual exploitation as the predominant form. While this is a huge issue in many countries around the world it is also a huge issue in Canada.

The latest report conducted by Statistics Canada regarding human trafficking was in 2014. The highlights include the rate of police-reported human trafficking violations nearly doubled year to year, and the victims are majorly young women with persons accused tending to be men. The overall picture of human trafficking in Canada has police concerned that there may be more victims and urge anyone affected to report human trafficking occurrences.




# Police-Reported Human Trafficking Violations in Canada



# UNCOVERING THE BANNING

eing the second largest nation in the world, Canada possesses a distinct governing system that entails independent provincial authority due to varying geographic features and interests. This results in different regional dynamics and causes leaders to enforce certain regulations that may not be acknowledgeable by other provinces, such as this present case in Quebec.

Even though Canada has been globally known to be a country that values multiculturalism, it seems that its French province doesn't seem to fully embody this gesture. On October 18, a new legislation was passed in Quebec that forbids the use of the niqab or burqa for face coverings upon usage of public transit or other government services. The law, which is believed to be the first of its kind in North America, has sparked tremendous controversy amongst the general public, catalyzing interest on the debate of cultural inclusivity not just within the province, but also in all of Canada.

The premier of Quebec, Philippe Couillard, asserts that the prohibition is for "communication, identification, and safety purposes" as we are in a "free and democratic society". The bill or "Bill 62" was two years worth of work by the Liberal government to supposedly tackle the issue of state neutrality. It was amended in August to extend the ban from government departments and provincially funded institutions to municipal services, including public transit and subsidized housing. "The law, which is believed to be the FIRST of its kind in North America" The new law instigated two extreme reactions. On one, the three opposing parties believe that the law doesn't go as far as religious symbols, deeming it as practically ineffective. On the other, Muslim advocates from all over the province vehemently declare that it is a racist act because it inhibits expression of their religion. The Liberal government of Ontario also argues that the new legislation counters the country's Charter of Rights and Freedoms and could potentially yield legal challenges.

In the following month, criticism on Bill 62 has increased with thousands of protesters taking over the streets of Montreal to show their complete abhorrence of the legislation. The rally consisted of primarily Muslim advocates, women's groups, as well as university student associations. Face-covered protestors marched across the streets while chanting "So- soso- solidarity" and "Everybody hates racists." Some have even gone beyond protest to the extreme of vandalism as a famous statue of Sir John A. Macdonald in the city was found covered in red paint prior the march.

Two days after the legislation was passed, Prime Minister Justin Trudeau took the mediator role to examine the case, pointing that it is not the role of government to tell women what they can or can't wear. He further states that the federal government will study the implications of the law and determine a proper direction to tackle this matter, having the Charter of Rights and Freedoms as basis. "The federal government has an obligation to accept the fact that the provinces have a right to pass their own legislation, but as you know full well, as a Liberal, at the federal level, I believe fundamentally in rights, in the Charter of Rights and Freedoms and I will always defend that," Trudeau said.

With the matter escalating and being recognized widely, there is no telling how much further the province can live up to Canada's world-renowned multicultural society. In addition, tension will not only persist between the locals and the provincial government, but also may arise between the provincial and the federal governments. However, with a diverse population of 36 million, Canada has major cultural backups and can certainly provide many voices for Muslims to advocate for equality.

# SHE CARES

The on-going conflict in Gaza has struck a chord here at SHE and in many hearts as the need for aid increases. Islamic Relief Canada is at the forefront of organizations providing aid. The organization has been fundraising relief services for more than 25 years across 35 countries, and are currently putting their resources towards Palestinians. Over 2000 Palestinians have been killed by Israeli

bombardments. Of that, 600 of the Palestinian victims killed are children. While vital medical and food supplies dwindle, Islamic Relief Canada is fundraising for medical aid, food aid and non-food items, as well as hygiene and sanitation kits for the Al-Shifa hospital and clinics. SHE cares and is emphasizing the need to take part. 

#### CAN YOU EXPLAIN GUT HEALTH?

"Gut health" is on trend and many people are hearing these two words, but don't fully understand what it means to have a healthy gut. I ask my patients questions to assess their gut health such as their bowel regularity, any energy or skin-related symptoms (as they could be the signs of a toxic colon), and whether they experience any digestive symptoms (such as gas, bloating, cramping, etc.) Over 2000 years ago, a Greek physician Hippocrates stated, "all disease begins in the gut". 
